Still time to apply

Late application – you can still apply through UCAS until 30
 June

 If you didn't use all five choices, you can log back in to UCAS and add another choice (as long as you've not accepted or declined any offers)

UCAS Extra - you can add a further choice if you:

- Weren't accepted by any of your five choices
- Declined the offers you received
- Last date to add a UCAS Extra Choice is 4 July
- Late and Extra applications will be considered on a first-come, first-served basis
- Applications received after 30 June are entered into Clearing





What's Clearing and who's it for?

Clearing is a chance to look for remaining spaces available on a variety of courses starting this September

- If you've already made an application...
 - If you don't meet requirements of your firm and insurance offers, you will automatically be entered into Clearing by UCAS.
 - If your results exceed those required for your firm choice offer, there's still time to find a place (subject to availability) through Clearing.
 - If you've changed your mind about your choices and want to 'shop around' there are usually thousands of places available through Clearing.
- If you haven't already applied...
 - You can still apply. Start a UCAS application at ucas.com, or contact universities when Clearing opens to see if you can make a direct application. You will be able to apply direct to BU using our online application form

Clearing process









1. Visit ucas.com

If you've not yet made a uni application, you'll need to register with UCAS and make an application

If you applied earlier in the cycle and you don't get the grades you were expecting, your UCAS Hub will say you are in Clearing

- Visit ucas.com and university websites to explore all Clearing vacancies
- 3. Make a shortlist of what and where you'd like to study

Take some of the stress away by knowing who you'd like to call, and what you'd like to ask.

4. Get on the phone and call your shortlist!

Prepare for the call by making a list of all your qualifications (including GCSEs/equivalent) and your UCAS ID





What next?



5. Got an offer and made your decision? It's time to add your Clearing choice on UCAS. The university will give you two codes – the institution and course code. Alternatively, the university may accept a direct applica UCAS At the heart of connecting people to higher education Burnemouth University





6. Check the UCAS website to make sure the university has confirmed your place and read the information from your university to check everything is correct.

Use the opportunity to find out more about your course on the university website. Many universities will also offer **Open Days**.





Entry Requirements

- We can't discuss our Clearing entry requirements, but for courses that still have spaces, we're typically more relaxed with what we can accept
- We do still require the minimum equivalent of one full A-level for Foundation Years, two full A-levels for year one entry, and most of our courses also have a GCSE English and Maths requirement (grade C/4 or above)
- Some of our courses still have a personal statement, portfolio or interview requirement during Clearing – so it's good to be prepared!
- If you're asked for a personal statement, this can be a different one to your main cycle application
- You can start your application before Results Day, but we'll need your results before we can confirm your place at BU



Foundation Years at BU

- Initial year of study prior to progressing onto the first year of one of our eligible degrees
- Right for you if:
 - You don't have the right qualifications for a full degree
 - You have the qualifications but not ready for degreelevel study yet
 - You are returning to study after a gap

Subject areas:

- Business & Management
- Creative Industries
- Engineering
- Media & Communication
- Science
- Technology

Entry requirements:

48-72 UCAS tariff points



We're all different


At BU we have greater flexibility with our entry requirements during Clearing.

- If you're holding a firm or insurance offer with BU, we'll consider you under our Clearing criteria when we look at your results.
- If you applied to us earlier in the cycle you can still apply again through Clearing (if you were unsuccessful after a Health and Social Science interview, or a portfolio submission, we can't consider you for the same course sorry ③).
- If you're applying through Clearing, or making a new application, tell us about your grades and any extra-curricular activities. We want to make a decision based on everything you can bring to the course.
